

## Overview of PE at AO, and the positive impact that the sports funding is having.

PE at Ashford Oaks has continued to grow in stature, both in PE lessons and when attending sporting events. Children have taken great pride when representing Ashford Oaks in Sports competitions, with 2021/2022 being our most successful year to date.

Teachers continue to work closely with the sports lead (Tom Scorer) to provide engaging PE lessons that show clear differentiation over the course of the topic, to suit every child's needs. Children are exposed to a wider range of activities throughout the year and are beginning to have more of a say on the types of activities that they would like to cover. Recently our teachers took part in a survey with the outcome showing that they generally feel confident in teaching PE lessons and support is given to them to help where necessary. Our PE curriculum offers a wide range of topics, exposing our children to new skills and challenges.

After School Sports Clubs have been extremely popular, with the demand for more being clear in our recent pupil voice survey. Parental support with children taking part in competitions is very good and transport is provided to those who are unable to get to the relevant places to take part in competitions. Move & Groove still continues to be a huge part of a weekly routine and therefore will be continuing this year. Move and Groove is a whole school initiative, that allows children and adults to come together, enabling pupils across the school to start the day positively.
